OTHER SERVICES MSC PROVIDES

- Employment Jobs and Skills Centre (JSC) for access education, training and employment opportunities.
- **Disability** Multicultural Disability Services Program (MDSP) and Independent Disability Services (IDS) for reliable, culturally appropriate independent support and support coordination with an NDIS Plan.
- Aged Care Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP) for people over 65 years of age to assist with social and home support. Home Care Packages (HCP) for older persons to facilitate independent living through personalised supports.
- **Family** Family Dispute Resolution Services (RAWA) offers family mediation and counselling for individuals, couples and children.
- Housing Community Housing Program (CHP) offers assistance to find rental accommodations, maintain current tenancies and avoid homelessness.
- **Finance** Emergency Relief (ER) to assist with payment of utility bills and other emergency financial difficulties to eligible clients.

Permanent Residents:

- Refugee & humanitarian entrants
- Family & partner visas stream migrants (low English) proficiency)
- Working & skilled visas (dependents only in rural and regional areas with low English proficiency)
- Selected other stream visas (i.e. Former Resident and witness protection)
- Migrants with a Pacific Engagement Visa (PEV) or are part of the Pacific Australia Labour Mobility (PALM) visa scheme
- Migrants who have been in Australia for over 5 years that may need assistance

Temporary Visas:

- Humanitarians stay visa
- Visitor Visa (limited to certain nationals)
- Family & Partner Visa (low English proficiency)
- Dependents of selected temporary residents (Professional Skilled, Provisional Business or Investment) in rural and regional areas with low English proficiency
